

On the week of November 28, The University of Virginia Foundation began work on demolishing the former Chevron station, a property it owns at 100 Emmet Street, and the building on the adjoining site, 104 Emmet Street, which is owned by the University. The demolition will take about 10 days, and the land will be graded and planted with grass.

A second phase of the project will improve the intersection geometry and drainage, add a dedicated bicycle lane on University Avenue, rebuild new curbs and sidewalks, and add more shade trees in the area. The second phase will be funded jointly by the University and the City of Charlottesville. The improvements to this important intersection demonstrate the University's commitment to enhancing our environment in partnership with the community.
