 Beginning in 1992, at the University of Virginia, salary increases were given on December 1 of each year. The above averages for UVa include the December 1 increases each year.
 In 1996-97 and 1997-98, all University of California Institutions received 5% increases on November 1 instead of at the beginning of the year. Estimates of those increases have been included in the above figures even though they were not included in the AAUP report.
 In 1995-96, Emory U. and UC Santa Barbara were added to the AAU and to the above list of institutions.
 In 1996-97, UC Davis and UC Irvine were added to the AAU and to the above list of institutions.
 A drop, between 1996-97 and 1997-98, in the mean compensation reported at Rutgers U - New Brunswick was caused by significant reorganization and redistribution of faculty between campuses.
 A drop, between 1998-99 and 1999-2000, in the mean compensation reported at Tulane was caused by the inclusion, for the first time, of unranked faculty in their survey population.
 In 1999, Clark University withdrew from the AAU.
