DISCUSSION: Mr. Devvarman became the first Atlantic Coast Conference men's tennis player to win the NCAA singles championship on May 28, 2007. He turned down opportunities to play on the professional tennis circuit and thus returned to the University in order to graduate in his fourth year.

The University's men's tennis team recently won the ITA National Team Tennis Championship in Seattle, becoming the first Atlantic Coast Conference team ever to win a tennis national championship. Mr. Devvarman was named the Most Outstanding Player in this year's ITA National Team Indoor Championship.
