911 Emergency Telephone System Tax, 2002

Section §58.1-3813 of the *Code of Virginia* allows any city, county, or town that has established or will establish an enhanced 911 emergency telephone system to impose a special local tax on the consumer of telephone services. The tax cannot be imposed on federal, state, or local government agencies. Any tax imposed under this section must be utilized solely for the initial capital, installation, and maintenance costs of the emergency telephone system. For the

purpose of compensating the telephone utility for accounting and remitting the tax levied by this section, such telephone utility shall be allowed 3 percent of the amount of the tax due.

Table 14.1 provides the year 2002 special tax rates for enhanced 911 emergency telephone services for the 38 cities, 88 counties, and 21 towns that report imposing this tax. The tax ranges from \$0.26 per month to \$3.00 per month.
