BUFFETT FELLOWSHIPS FOR SUMMER 2011

The Center for Children, Families, and the Law is now accepting applications for Buffett Fellowships for the Summer of 2011.

Graduate Students of **any discipline** (Law, Education, Economics, Psychology, etc.) at the University of Virginia who are planning to be involved in **applied** work in the topic area of children and families in need are welcome to apply.

Applicants are encouraged to think broadly and creatively in applying for a Buffett Fellowship. Examples of appropriate applied activity include:

- Law students working in public service settings and representing children and/or families
- Clinical psychology graduate students working as therapists with children and/or families in need
- Economics or business students who plan to assist a child welfare or family agency with fund raising or financial management
- Sociology graduate students who plan to help to mobilize volunteers or garner community support for a family or child advocacy initiative

Innovation is encouraged in thinking broadly about applied work with children and families.

The maximum award is \$3500 for full time summer internship, but awards typically range from \$1000 to \$3000 depending on the proposal and the number of hours involved in providing service. Please have your application submitted no later than **April 1st**.
