The University of Virginia urges all members of the University community to report promptly any bias incident directed against a University student on Grounds, in the Charlottesville/Albemarle area, or during a University-sponsored activity. The information you report on this form will be provided to the University's Chief Operating Officer, the Vice President and Chief Student Affairs Officer, the Office of the Dean of Students, the University Police Department, and possibly to other University officials involved in any subsequent monitoring, investigation and/or adjudication of the incident.

If you are the victim of a hate or bias-related incident - racial or otherwise - or you witnessed a hate or bias-related incident, please do the following to document the incident the best you can:

- If you experienced a written slur or discovered graffiti, do not erase the text. The police will need to see it.
- If you have a camera or cell phone camera, take a picture of the evidence, any physical injuries sustained, license plate, or anything else relevant.
- If the incident was verbal, please write down exactly what was said to the best of your recollection.
- Retain the contact information of any possible witnesses.
- Speed and accuracy are critical, so please act immediately!
